

Camp Fees:

WEEKLY PRE-PAYMENT IS REQUIRED

\$25 Daily or \$120 Weekly

+ Field Trip Fees

Field trip fee's will vary weekly and be posted based on each trip

Fees include lunch, snacks, supplies & special events each week!

DSHS must be preapproved to start

Only pay for the days you attend!

Camp Dues

Registration Fees

\$30 per child/\$50 per family

Weekly Tuition based on attendance

Field Trip Fees vary depending on the trip

Payment Perks & Reminders

- A 10% deduction in camp fees will be given for 2 or more children in one family
 - 2 Field Trips per week
- Pre-payment is required each week
- \$10 late payment fee will be assessed if payment is not received by Wednesday of each week
- At the end of summer, payments not used will be refunded. A \$25 processing fee will be charged, or the full amount may be used for other Boys & Girls Club programs

Parents must sign their children into and out of camp each day. Only authorized adults will be allowed to pick up children.

Photo I.D. is required

Camp Information:

- Monday– Friday 6:30 am-6:00 pm
- Late pick up fee \$1 per minute per child after 6pm
 - Child Care available for children 5-12, Kindergarten completion required
- Complete registration is required for all children prior to attending

Registration Includes: Registration Form, Immunization Records, and Emergency Card

- ♦ Medication will only be given to children after a medical release form has been signed by a parent or guardian. Medication must be brought in the prescription container and be labeled with child's name.
- ♦ Field trip **permission forms** must be filled out at time of registration. Dates, locations & times will be given out on a weekly basis. **Children must wear BGC T-shirts on field trips, with the exception of swim days.**
- ♦ We reserve the right to remove from camp any child who is disruptive. Inappropriate language/behavior will not be tolerated. If a child is unable to correct his/her behavior, we may call the parent/guardian to pick up the child before the end of the camp day. Any child who persists with disruptive behavior may be dismissed from camp without any refund of fees.
